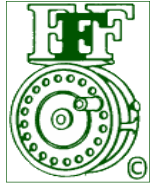

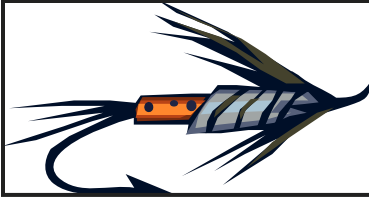

(Jan had fished the day before when the weather was totally nasty.) They floated from Sloway to St Regis on Saturday and the wind didn't blow very often and it didn't rain very much and the catching was fair. The weather was much better on Sunday for the short float from Dry Creek to Sloway but the catching wasn't as good as the fishing conditions.

One indication of this group's dedication might be that in their two days on the river they didn't see a single other boat!

### INTERMEDIATE (we think we're better than we really are) AND BEYOND (those that really are better and tie faster)

#### 2008 FLY TYING

Picture this. It's cold and dark. It's January. The holidays are over (but not football). Fishing options are slim and none. All you have are fishing memories from last year and hopes, dreams and expectations of the season to come. Think back to last season.

Remember those fish rising up, taking something off the surface and leaving telltale bubbles, or tails and fins showing, or busy water, or fish feeding just underneath the surface, or the wake made by a fish heading for *something*, or other fishers strike indicators disappearing under the water and yours remaining steadfastly topside. The fish were feeding but you didn't have or weren't using the right pattern for the stage of life cycle of the fly the fish were eating.

This year our intermediate and beyond fly tying hopes to solve part of that problem by teaching patterns that represent the different life cycle stages of may flies, caddis and chironomids (you'll still have to decide which one to use). Back by popular demand, we will also have a session on foam flies taught by Dale Esau.

All those signed up will have an opportunity to request patterns they wish to learn (within the categories of the 08 curriculum). You may also request techniques that will be incorporated into the patterns.

THINGS CHANGE! The night – THURSDAY, the place - WHITE'S BOOTS  
the cost - \$20 to 25 We will purchase the materials to be used collectively, package them individually by pattern and hand them out to each tier the night the pattern is tied. We hope this saves tiers time and money & helps in the correctness of tying patterns.

Time – 7 -9 pm, be there and ready to tie by 7pm
