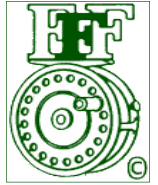

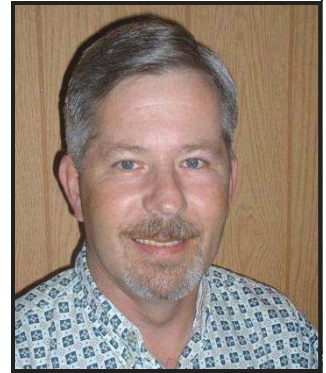

ONE FLY CONTEST - MAY 10TH - BADGER LAKE

One fly outing? The rules are simple: We each pick one fly (barbless only) and then catch and release as many fish as possible between 10 AM and 1:30 PM. You keep track of the number of fish caught and the length of your longest fish (for tie breaking purposes). If you lose or change your fly, any fish caught with the replacement fly cannot be counted in the competition.

CLARK CANYON OUTING - July 11th to 13th

Host: Judy Kaufman

This is a new SFF outing, never been done before. The information about campgrounds, fishing conditions, what flies to use, where to fish, what other fishing opportunities in the surrounding area is given through research not personal experience. That's my disclaimer! How to get to Clark Canyon Reservoir - EAST ON I 90 TO I 15 (just west of Butte) SOUTH ON I15 (through Dillon) about 20 miles further to the lake.

Where to camp – THE LONETREE CAMPGROUND I15 exit 37 to Red Rock Road, continue on Red Rock to Old Armstead Rd. Turn Left on Armstead continue until you see the campground road. Turn toward lake.

In case that's full, continue on Old Armstead Rd about 2 miles to Hap Hawkins Campground. There are tent and trailer (RV) sites, fire pits, handicapped accessible, water, toilets, trash removal, picnic shelter.

Campgrounds are Bureau of Reclamation, the camping is free but no reservations. First come first serve. There should be room at Lonetree.

Flies - This will be primarily subsurface for 14" to 22" rainbows & browns. Bring damsel nymphs (Sheep Creek) & adults, woolly buggers, Callibaetis Flashback, Chironomids, bait fish patterns, more about this later.

Other fishing opportunities nearby – Beaverhead River, Poindexter Slough, Big Hole River, Ruby River, etc.

Potluck meal – We'll probably do something, don't know what just yet.

Places to stay & a good fly shop in Dillon - Comfort Inn, Super 8, Best Western, & Frontier Anglers (happy to give information) (406) 683-5276.

If you're up for an adventure & your gasoline budget allows, join us and be a member of the first (or last) annual Clark Canyon Reservoir Outing.

KELLY CREEK OUTING - JULY 26TH & 27TH Hosts: Rick and Sue Hodges

The snow pack has been excellent this year and Kelly Creek should be in top condition. The cutthroat are always willing so join us for a weekend of excellent walk and wade fishing. Camping headquarters will be Kelly Forks campground. There are a number of other excellent forest service camp grounds along the N. Fork Clearwater for overflow if necessary. It is a good idea to arrive early if possible as this area is becoming more and more popular.

Getting there is a bit of a challenge but well worth the effort. The recommended route from Spokane is East on I-90 to exit 47 at Superior MT. Make a right turn at the foot of the off ramp then a left. Stop and fill your gas tank. This is the last services available. Continue past the gas station and follow forest road 250 over Hoodoo pass into Idaho. 55 miles of mostly good gravel road later you will arrive at the confluence of Kelly Creek and the North Fork of the Clearwater River. Turn left at the intersection and you will find the campground just across the bridge. Some of this route is narrow and not suited for large RV's. If you are driving or pulling one of these, contact the host for information.

This is prime wild cutthroat water. They love to rise to attractor patterns. Some useful patterns are stimulators, royal wolfs, humpies (red), and parachute adams. You can expect to see good caddis hatches especially in the evenings and elk hair caddis in olive and tan work well. Idaho licenses are available at Sportsman's Warehouse, Cabela's, or directly over the internet.

We plan on a group breakfast Saturday morning where we will make plans for the day and share any tips and information needed. So plan on coming for great scenery and fishing. If you can make it, please contact the hosts as early as possible.
