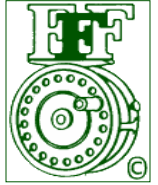

(Leaping Fish, Flying Bobbers, and Buddy Can You Spare Another Worm?)  
**CLEAR LAKE, SATURDAY, MAY 2<sup>ND</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ 7 AM**

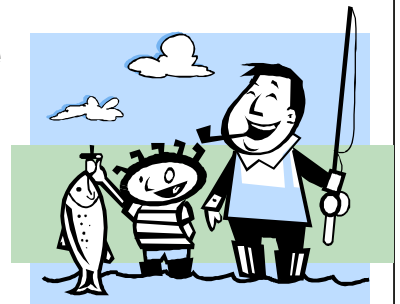

The dock and the shore are lined with kids, parents, grandparents, and volunteers. The signal to fish is sounded. The air is filled with red and white bobbers (strike indicators to fly anglers); they hit the water and disappear. Shouts of “you got him, reel him in, way to go” are heard up and down the dock and beach! Another Kids Fishing Day is launched. Between the hours of 8AM and 3Pm, 1,000 kids age 5 – 14 will have the opportunity to fish. They will succeed. They fish for 30 minutes or catch 3 fish (whichever comes first). Every child catches at least one fish and goes home with a Zebco rod, reel, line and T-shirt, all this for \$5.

The Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife & C.A.S.T. present the event for Kids Foundation. The program is aimed at getting more kids involved in fishing. The Spokane Fly Fishers, other fishing, youth organizations and businesses help sponsor this event monetarily and with heartfelt labor. About the labor part, we need you to volunteer. If you do, here are some of the tasks you may be performing: help with baiting hooks, casting, reeling, landing, unhooking fish, putting fish in plastic bags, taking & posing for pictures & CHEERING on young anglers. If you prefer to stay dry and fish scent free, there are non-fish jobs to do. If you are really into it, you can help clean the caught fish. You will need to be at Clear Lake at the Air Force Camping Area by 7:00AM on Saturday, May2nd. There is a for fee breakfast offered at the lake starting at 6:00AM (we may gather elsewhere for breakfast, stay tuned). You’ll have a great time at this event and probably sign up next year! ## ONE FLY CONTEST - MAY 10<sup>TH</sup> at BADGER LAKE

The ONE FLY CONTEST is a great way to learn what flies will catch the most fish at this time of year in Badger Lake. If you already know this (and know where the fish are), and catch the most fish, you will win 1<sup>st</sup> place and a \$30 gift certificate to your favorite fly-fishing store (located in the Spokane area). If you catch the second most fish you win a \$20 certificate, third place, a \$10 certificate. **THERE WILL BE OTHER AWARDS PRESENTED.** Basically the rules are: choose one barbless fly, catch and release as many fish as possible between 10 AM and 1:30 PM, count the number of fish caught and record the length of the longest (for tie breaking purposes), if you lose the fly you originally tied on, count only the fish caught to that point, you may continue to fish with another fly but you are out of the contest.

Be prepared for foul weather! Most ONE FLY CONTESTS are contended in rainy, snowy, windy weather. Last year was typical. The weather was really nasty. There were 25 anglers signed up and 9 showed.

Registration begins at 9:30 AM with a donation of \$5 per member and \$10 per family or non-member. Donations will benefit SFF Club programs. There will be coffee and morning snacks available. **THE REAL HIGH POINT OF THE ONE FLY CONTEST IS THE BBQ FOLLOWING THE FISHING!** Burgers, beans, and all the extras will be served! The wonderful and strikingly attractive host of this outing needs all the help she can get! ## MC DOWELL LAKE OUTING – May 30 & 31

This is a walk in lake, so a pontoon or float tube is needed. Traveling north on US 395 near the town of *Arden*, look for the *Crossroads Bar & Grill*...it will be on the right side of the road just past Stimson lumber mill on the left. Turn right (just before the bar) on *Rocky Lane* and one block later turn left on *Old Highway*. Drive 0.6 miles then turn right on *Artman-Gibson Road*. Go 3.9 miles and turn right on *Kitt-Narcisse Road*. 2.2 miles later bear right when the road splits at the sign for Bailey Lake – McDowell Lake. This is also where the pavement ends. Continue another 2.6 miles to *Narcisse Creek Road*. Turn left on NCR and drive 2.9 miles (bearing right at two forks in the road) to the campground (on the right just after you cross a bridge). NOTE: (1) Forks are about 45 degree angles...don't make any 90 degree right turns onto the dirt roads leading off to the right. (2) I did not make up these street names...they are for real. The campground has plenty of room, many good campsites, fire pits and a new outhouse. If it is open past the campground, the road you drove in on will take your truck and maybe a car, to the south end of the lake, but you will have to hike down a pretty steep hill to the lake. This is the route usually taken by people with pontoon boats since access from the campground to the north end of the lake involves a half mile walk on a newly graveled trail. For youngsters the Little Pend Oreille River (a small creek containing very cooperative little Brook Trout) runs right next to the campground.

Recommended Flies: Halloween Bugger, Water Boatmen, Chironomids, Soft Hackles, Ants, Alice's Don't Ask and the Red Butt Guaranteed.

## 2009 CONSERVATION RAFFLE REPORT

Thank you to the donors, participants, and workers that made this year's raffle the most successful ever. Also, congratulations to the many lucky winners who took home some great items. Please be sure to say thank you to the donors for the items you won. So far over \$5,000 has been raised to support SFF conservation projects and grants. The first grant will provide a new wind turbine for Z Lake. This turbine in conjunction with

an existing solar system powers an electric compressor motor that powers a diffuser to help keep a portion of the lake ice free. This system benefits the lake ecosystem that Dr. Ross Black, Fisheries Professor at Eastern Washington University has said has the potential to become one of the best trout lakes in the region. The remainder of the funds will be held in the SFF Conservation fund and will be used to fund additional projects.
